PASTORAL CARE @ WPS

A friendly reminder that we use our Weymouth Way. We think. We help. We learn. We care, to keep our school a safe and happy place. We work with all our children to look after our environment inside and outside, speak in a polite and friendly manner, play safely and nicely with others, play in the right areas and treat everyone fairly and with respect. Attached is the 'complaints process' if you have any concerns, please follow the diagram attached. Teachers have a 3-Step method they follow in their classes and in the playground.

For major behaviours of: causing harm, swearing directly at a person and damaging property—we send children home for the day for their consequence and ask parent support to discuss what the expectations are. Children return the following day and continue with their learning.

Jan May is our school chaplain who works on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and children self refer in the box in the office to talk over any concerns they have.

Our social worker—Rennee Kumia works on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. You can ring the office to book an appointment.

NEW LEARNING SPACE OPENING AND BLESSING—All Rangi team whanau are invited to the opening of our new learning space for their children on Tuesday 30 July at 9.30am.

ATTENDANCE—This term we are going for 95% attendance. Each team has got systems in place to encourage children to come to school every day. KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE


